	 There is a lot of construction happening on Locomotive Street. As construction concludes we're slowly opening up the public domain. Mitchell Way and Central Avenue are the next stage. 	
	Member Feedback	
	 RJ - any update on the Locomotive Workshop traverser and any change in plans for the public artworks? WW - we have built and installed several public artworks already. This includes the Jonathan Jones artwork in the Axle foyer, The Treehouses and 'Happy Rain' by artist Nell in Eveleigh Green. We're soon to install the remaining artworks. NV - the traverser has been moved into temporary storage during construction. We're working with City of Sydney to identify its final location. MB - how far along is the development? WW - there are five work areas. Building 1, Building 2; Building 3; the 	
	 WW - there are five work areas. Building 1, Building 2, Building 3, the Public Domain; and Locomotive Workshop. All done by April 2021. MB - how many people will be on site upon completion? WW - about 20,000, including visitors. LTPG - have you calculated how many visitors and workers will be on site at any one time? WW - approximately 20,000. LTPG - is that in April 2021? WW - yes. 	
5.	Locomotive Workshop Development and Heritage Update	
	Will Walker provided a development update on the Locomotive Workshop, including recent modifications.	
	 Once complete, there will be 22,000sqm of office space and 8,000sqm of industrial/production style retail space. Future tenants in the Locomotive Workshop will include Eveleigh Works; Top Education; The Grounds; Romeo's IGA; Bodyfit; Quantium; a distillery; and Hoist (which is 100% owned by Mirvac). All new tenants are excited to work with the unique heritage of the site. 	
	Member Feedback	
	 DH - do the tenants take up much space? WW - we put in place a vision for the space - it's about creating a neighbourhood for workers, visitors, and tourists. This place has been unwelcoming to outsiders for many years, so we've put in a scooter park and a child's play area to try and encourage more people to visit. DH - this place has been very welcoming to the local community. 	
	 LTPG - we weren't aware of the scooter park. It has caused a lot of distress. 	
	 WW – we understood there was demand for a scooter park. We are working to mitigate any effects of the scooter park, e.g. we have 24/7 security patrols, we've responded to requests from residents to change the timing of the lights to go off earlier and have held meetings with skaters. LTPG - the City of Sydney are installing a new skate park.

	want to hear about.	
	LTPG - we want to talk about the impact of the development of the	
	surrounding neighbourhood. Harold Park is really calm - keep that in mind	
	for South Eveleigh. Create places for relaxation as well. Consider the	
	impact of the additional 10,000 people using the site. It will be a really	
	appealing place if it stays quite tranquil.	
	DH - we don't want the area to be activated at all hours of the day.	
	WW - the reason we're spending so much money on the public domain is	
	because we want this space to be well activated and make it a better	
	space for more people.	
	MB - when I moved here 34 years ago South Eveleigh was a dangerous,	
	unhygienic place. The Government were forced to come in and clean it	
	up. They brought in more car parks. It was made very clear from the	
	original ATP strategy that these buildings were always going to be built.	
	GT - there needs to be a locomotive of some description in the public	
	domain. The space around the heritage buildings must be treated	
	carefully.	
	WW - Innovation Plaza, the cultural garden, and the Locomotive	
	Workshop will be the heart of the precinct. We want to draw people up	
	into the space.	
	GT - you need to juggle this use with the commuters using the space for	
	walking. You also need to accommodate service vehicles.	
	WW - we will continue to adjust our plans as we move into the future.	
	DH - there needs to be respect for what is here.	
	WW - the construction team have the absolute utmost respect for the	
	heritage of the site.

	installation. We also started to develop the framework for the digital platform,	
	including the filming of the first heritage short video within the Locomotive	
	Workshop.	
	During October to Nevember we have continued with the detailed decimal	
	 During October to November we have continued with the detailed design of the exhibition spaces as well as filming short videos of the Locomotive 	
	Workshop. We have continued to collaborate with the Blacksmith.

	 In December we'll start to work with Julian Bickersford to create a museum-quality database of the heritage collection. We'll also be starting interviews with local experts and knowledge-holders to gather stories and knowledge for our displays and digital overlay. In January 2020 we will start the process of choosing objects for the exhibition. For example, we'll be working with the Blacksmith to identify tools for the Blacksmiths tool wall. In the process of removing the modern 1990's fitout, we revealed a wooden canteen wall which we will work to restore and display. We have revealed a canteen, archaeologists on site almost every day. Videography and photography being taken throughout the process The Blacksmith is excited about future plans. Display cases and curiosity boxes to be installed. We're designing things so that we have flexibility to do a variety of exhibitions. We're in the process of designing our virtual reality displays. We're also currently looking at the materiality of the flooring and furniture. We'll also be working on the removal of the temporary annex to reveal the heritage wall. Our team are working meticulously to restore the heritage of the building fabric. It is a privilege to work on such a great project with such an extensive budget. RJ – I suggest that the presentation is sent around after the meeting. 	
8.	South Eveleigh – Workplace Travel Plan	
	 Jenifer Finucane and Brendan Thomas provided an overview of Commonwealth Bank's plans for workplace travel. Overview LTPG – are there any parking places on site? WW – Mirvac own 350 spaces on site. There is more than enough visitor parking. We're always working with the construction workers and subcontractors to educate them about parking issues. LTPG - have you surveyed the workers to assess how many workers are using public transport? DH - were Conditions B19 and B19e of SSDA 7317 satisfied? WW - yes. Commonwealth Bank have also prepared a Green Travel Plan. DH - can we see a copy of the Green Travel Plan? WW - yes. LTPG - do you anticipate that construction worker parking will reduce early next year? WW - yes, the number of construction workers on site have already decreased from the peak. LTPG - we have started to find that we can't park near our houses after doing groceries. Commonwealth Bank Workplace Travel Plans We recognise that the relocation of our staff to this site is a big deal. We know that there is a lot of intervention needed to manage this change. Most of our new workers will be moving from Parramatta and Lidcombe and they were used to driving.
