	 Difficult time for many during COVID-19. Many of our health and wellbeing facilities had to close and retailers had to close their doors or move to takeaway. We are hopeful that the easing of restrictions over the coming weeks and months will help bring the precinct back. Building 2 – the Foundry – is almost complete, along with the public domain work. We are looking forward to having CBA move into the Foundry over the coming months. We are nearing the end of the journey. WW spoke about being on the project for 4 years and the length of time it takes to design, build and complete. WW apologised for the noise and explained it's very difficult to avoid, especially when redoing roads. We are close to having buildings finished. We will hand over to CBA on 1 June. The surrounding public domain works should be finished at a similar time. New artwork is due for completion this year with the Pavilion by Chris Fox due to be completed shortly. There will be some reprieve from construction noise soon. Activations and programs for the tenants of South Eveleigh and the surrounding communities will resume as soon as we're able to. We want the activations to be welcoming, this will be led by our place team and our Ambassador Kylie Kwong. The precinct will continue to take form over the next 12 months and we'll see some big milestones met in the next 8 weeks. Members comments RJ: Have you considered the current pandemic in the fit-out process, in terms of lifts and end of trip facilities etc? WW: We have sat down with tenants to see if the way they work will change. The general theme is that working from home has been productive. They have all said that post COVID-19 they will do activity based working but they will put measures in place to ensure distancing. 	
	This will be managed through signage and physical barriers. Construction Update – Building 2, Public Domain and Locomotive Workshop	
	Adam Sutherland provided an overview of the major construction activities scheduled between April 2020 – May 2020. Construction Response to COVID-19 The COVID-19 pandemic is unchartered territory for all of us and we are learning how to live and work together as harmoniously as possible. Mirvac Construction continues to monitor guidance literature provided by Federal and State Government to develop protocols. Mirvac Constructions have a daily COVID-19 dial-in with all senior management and are working with the wider Mirvac Group to meet the challenges of working during the pandemic. Social distancing measures are being implemented within the South Eveleigh construction team. This includes: Observing a distance of 1.5m between people, where possible; Splitting larger meetings into smaller groups;

	 Staggering daily commencement times and meal breaks to reduce numbers in the site amenities; Restricting worker numbers in the lifts; and Reminding workers daily of social distancing measures through pre-starts and builder's briefs. 	
	 Government extension of construction hours The Environmental Planning and Assessment (COVID-19 Development – Construction Work Days) Order 2020 is now in place and allows construction sites in NSW to operate on weekends and public holidays. You can view a copy of the Order by searching for Government Gazette No 68 on gazette.legislation.nsw.gov.au. This new order will make it easier for workers to abide by social distancing rules while keeping construction projects progressing, by allowing building work to be spread across more days of the week. This means that construction at South Eveleigh is permitted to occur from 7:30am to 5:30pm, 7 days a week. At this stage we are proceeding only with light construction on a Sunday that is mostly internally in Building 2. In line with the Order, no high impact activities such as rock breaking, rock hammering, sheet piling, pile driving or similar activities will be carried out during these extended work hours.

	Heritage Interpretation. The Digital design layer aims to tell the stories we cannot capture in the physical design through different mediums such as projection, hologram, animation and more. Heritage Interpretation design is progressing into the tender finalisation and shop drawing phase. Mirvac are working closely with Curio and ICS to clean and treat heritage machines and tools for re-display on site. Mirvac and Curio are progressing the Design Development stage of the digital Heritage Interpretation Platform (Website) which will accompany the physical Heritage Interpretation scope and allow visitors to explore the information and history further. Curio have developed an exhibition style guide to be rolled out in Bays 1-4a Heritage interpretation zones, example images shown on slides. Workers Wall Mirvac are resolving final design documentation and compliance requirements for the substation on which the Workers Wall cladding will be applied. Curio are liaising with a potential manufacturer to guide build-ability.
